## Executive summary

After this, the ScienSeed company was selected to develop the ORION website. The website content will be managed by VA and the project manager, together with the support of an internal editorial board. 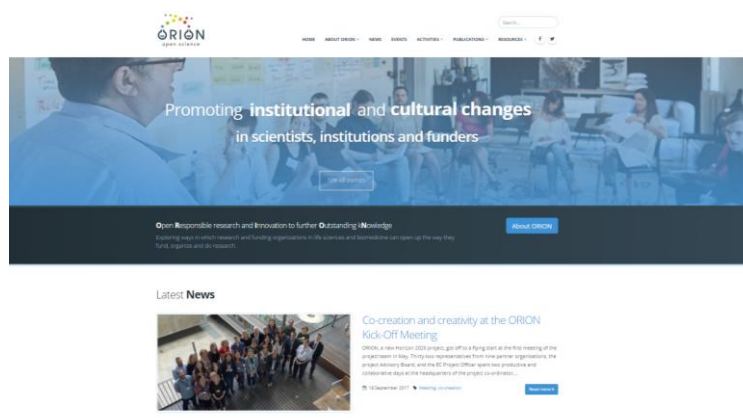
## Conclusions

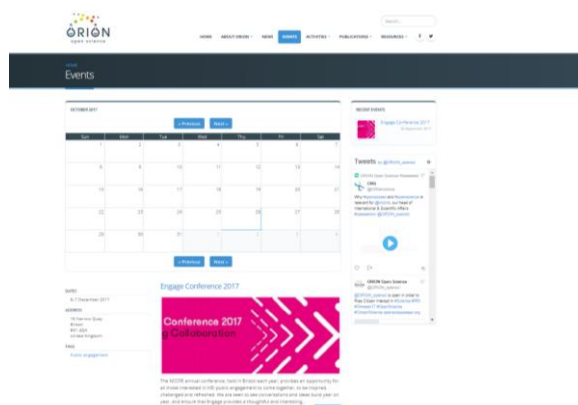

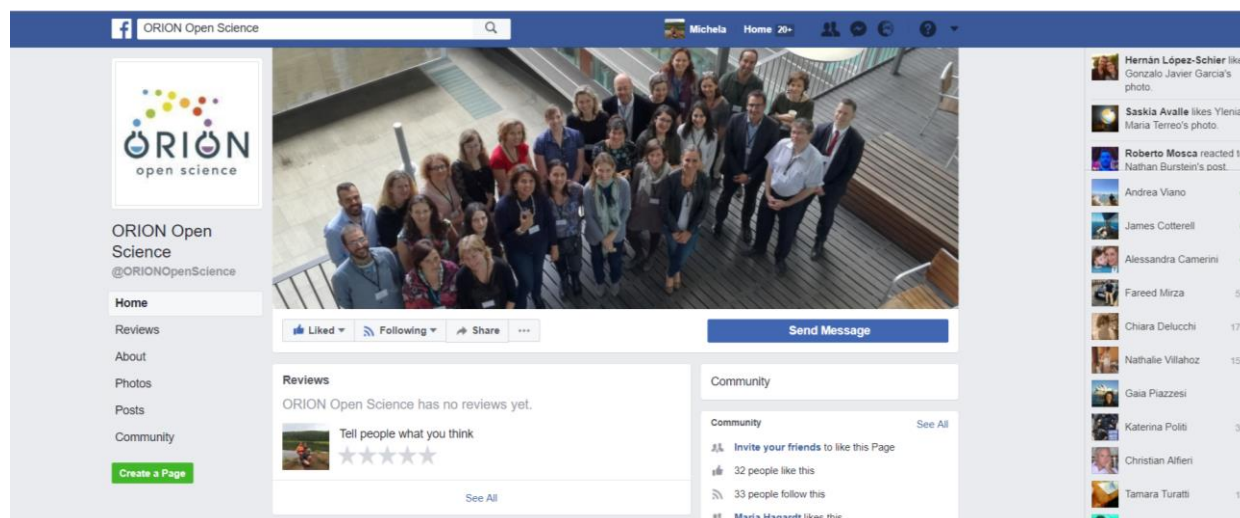
